

MPhil Programme in Hindi

School of Liberal Studies

- **Duration of the programme:** Normal duration of M. Phil. programme is 2 years (4 semesters).
- **Number of academic credits:** Course work of M. Phil. is 16 credits. **Completion and defense of an MPhil thesis is required.**
- **Medium of instruction:** Hindi.
- **Number of seats available:** 4 seats. **Reservation of seats** in accordance with Government of NCT rules.
- **Minimum eligibility:-** Masters degree in any field of the social sciences and humanities from a recognized institution with $\geq 55\%$ or equivalent CGA ($\geq 50\%$ for SC/ST/DD applicants).
- **Means of admission:** Written entrance test and entrance interviews for all applicants. All applicants must submit a Statement of Purpose and a research proposal (see General Instructions page on this website).

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- **Brief programme description:** The course work component of this M. Phil. programme consists of four courses of four credits each (total =16 credits). The courses offered are as follows:

1. Course I: Hindi Sahitya ke Itihas ki Samasyaen
2. Course II: Sahitya ka Samajshastra
3. Course III: Research Paper I- Essay/Seminar focusing on the theme of proposed research topic of the student. The topic shall be allotted to the student by the Research Studies Committee (RSC) of the School of Liberal Studies.
4. Course IV: Research Paper II- Seminar/Essay on the theme given to the student by the Research Studies Committee (RSC) keeping in view his/ her proposed research topic.

Course I and Course II are ‘taught courses’ for which regular classes will be held. Course III and Course IV are to be carried out by the student independently under the supervision of one or two faculty members. The ‘Theme’, ‘Topic’, or ‘Area’ of research for Course III and IV shall be decided by the Research Studies Committee of the School of Liberal Studies (SLS). Completing these four courses of four credits each successfully with requisite grade is an essential requirement for every M. Phil. student.

Dissertation research and writing commences officially after completion of course work and defense of a modified research proposal.
