### Hostel

AUD has about 45 seats for women in its Hostel in Kashmere Gate. The students will need to make their own travel arrangement from Hostel to AUD Karampura Campus.

### Minimum Eligibility

Class 10 +2 pass from CBSE or its equivalent from recognised board or university

### Selection Procedure

**Stage-I:** On the basis of Class 12 marks (points) + Points awarded for vocational Subject + Marks secured in Vocational Aptitude Test (VAT). Short listed candidates will be called for an interview.

**Stage-II:** Offer of admission will be based on the cumulative score on all the 4 criteria of Class 10+2 marks, points awarded for vocational subject in class 10+2, marks secured in VAT and the interview points.

Weightage during admission is given in the following:

- 40% weightage class 10+2 marks
- 10% weightage to vocational subject in class 10+2 (CBSE recognised vocational subjects)
- 25% Vocational Aptitude Test
- 25% weightage for Personal Interview

### Fee Structure

- Tuition fee: Rs.750/— per credit. Semester 1 = 30 credits. Total tuition fee for each semester Rs.22,500/-.
- Additional programme Enrichment fees: Rs.1000/- per semester. This is toward industry exposure, special seminars and interactions with industry experts.
- Student Welfare Fund Rs.500/- per semester.
- One time caution/Security Money of Rs.5000/— refundable on completion of the programme.

### Fee Waiver

The University offers full and Partial/full fee waivers to students who are in need of support given their economic background. Students with an annual family income of less than Rs. 6 Lakhs is considered for tuition fee-waiver. Full waiver of tuition fees extended to students belonging to SC, ST and PwD categories.

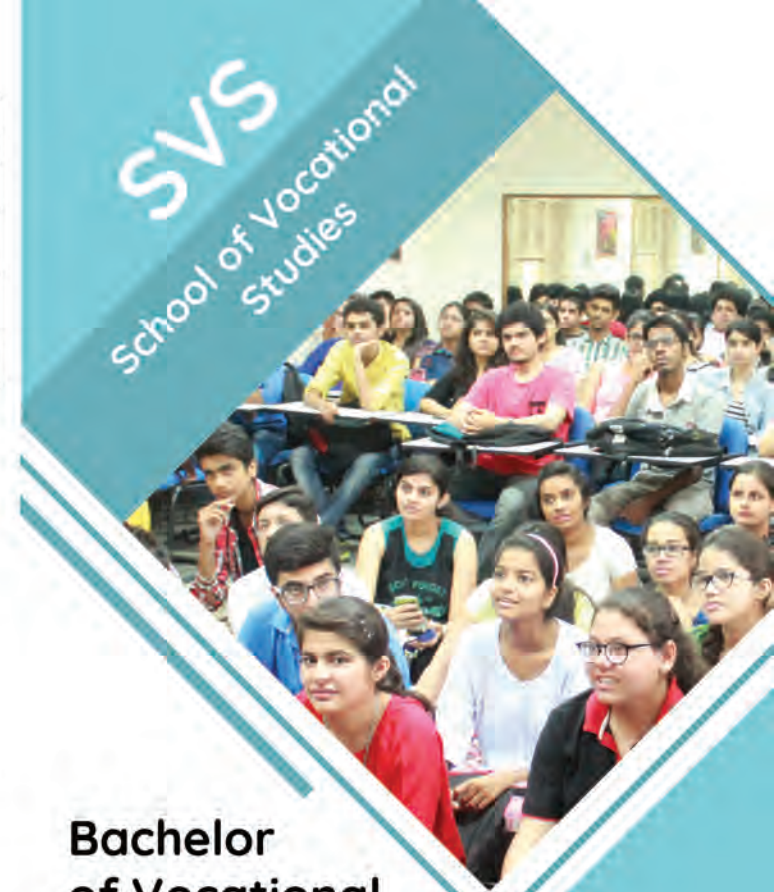

## SCHOOL OF VOCATIONAL STUDIES (SVS)

SVS has explored and developed programmes and courses that provides students with the required skill-set and academic background for meaningful employment once they graduate from the programme. It is envisaged that these programmes enable many of them to become self-employed, entrepreneurs, creators and generators of job for themselves and for many more educated youth in the society.

The BVoc programmes offered by the SVS, AUD, Karampura Campus, are unique because the curriculum for each vocational programme has been designed in close partnership with industry experts, industry associations, Sector Skill Councils, various Schools and Centres of the University and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) as well as professionals and academics.

SVS, following the University Grants Commission's (UGC) guidelines, offers multiple entry and exit options that lead to Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma and Bachelor of Vocation (BVoc) degrees.

component of practical of the Skill Courses are transacted in AUD Campus and Industrial Internship/Industrial Training in the concerned industry. The students' internship in their chosen vocation is introduced from Semester 1 to provide them with an opportunity to enter the job space of their choice early.

The curricula of the GEC have been designed with the help of internal AUD faculty and experts drawn from institutions/NGOs. They are designed to empower the students and keeping in mind their overall development in personal, social and work environments. The Language and Communication course of GEC is specifically designed to improve the English language proficiency communication skills and prepare them adequately for employment opportunities.

### **Credits: 30 credits in a semester**

Skill Courses: 18 credits per semester

General Education Component: 12 credits per semester.

## Teaching Methodology

The GEC and on-campus teaching of the skill theory and practicum are taught through a mix of methodologies – classroom, workshops, field attachments, projects, lab work and online facilitation.

## Faculty

The programmes are delivered by well qualified, experienced and dynamic faculty and professionals drawn from the respective industries.

## Assessment and Evaluation

The SVS follows a system of continuous assessment and evaluation (CAE).

Students are expected to attend the classes, skill-training components along with the orientation sessions at the beginning of the academic year.

SVS, AUD, follows a mandatory attendance policy of 80%. The penalties for low attendance are notified from time to time, and may include mandatory 'grade cuts' based on a sliding scale of attendance shortfall, withholding of grade card/transcript or other actions.
