Guidelines Related to Entrance Examination and Interview
MA Education, 2019-20

General Guidelines

- Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) admits students to its MA Education programme based on a written entrance examination followed by an interview. It is mandatory for candidates to appear for both written examination and interview to secure admission to this programme.
- The entrance examination and interview carry weightage of 75 marks and 25 marks respectively.
- The entrance examination for MA Education programme will be held on 8 July, 2019. The duration of the entrance examination is two and a half hours (10:00 am – 12:30 pm). Candidates are expected to report by 9:30 am at the [Kashmere Gate Campus](#) of Ambedkar University Delhi.
- Candidates shortlisted based on performance in written examination will be called for an interview at the [Lodhi Road Campus](#) of the University (located at BK Dutt Colony, Aliganj (Near Khanna Market), New Delhi - 110003). Interviews will be held on one or more days during 12-13 July 2019 anytime between 9:30 am and 6:00 pm.
- Candidates are required to bring a blue pen for the written entrance test. The question paper will be collected back from the candidates at the end of the examination.

Entrance examination and interview format

The format of this year's written entrance examination is as follows:

The question paper will have three sections. All the sections are compulsory.

- **Section A** (30 marks) will comprise of multiple choice questions which will assess candidates' general awareness pertaining to the field of education. Section A will need to be answered on the Question paper itself.
- **Section B** (20 marks) will comprise of short descriptive questions to assess candidates' familiarity with analysis of issues in the domains of education policy and ideas.
- **Section C** (25 marks) will comprise of descriptive and analytical questions which will require candidates to comprehend and reflect on the academic articles uploaded on the University website.

The interview of shortlisted candidates will aim to evaluate knowledge acquired as part of their previous education; their ability to explain their interest and understanding in the domain of educational thought, practice and related issues; and their aspirations for their prospective careers. The candidates shortlisted for the interview will be expected to write a statement of purpose on the day of the interview.
